"Why Do They Hate Us? Making Peace with the Muslim World" named one of Best Books of 2019

Author/Peace Activist Steve Slocum receives recognition for book challenging Islamophobia,

shedding light on Islam's peaceful mainstream

San Diego, CA (Dec. 18, 2019) — Local author and peace activist Steve Slocum (www.steveslocum.com) put his heart and soul into writing *Why Do They Hate Us? Making Peace with the Muslim World* on behalf of his Muslim friends who were being misunderstood, disparaged and attacked after the 9/11 tragedy. Today, Slocum's efforts are being rewarded — his book was named one of the Best Indie Books of 2019 by Kirkus Reviews and one of the Top 10 Books of 2019 by Booklist in Religion and Spirituality.

<u>Kirkus Reviews</u> called the book "A clear, concise, and thoughtful introduction to Islam. An exploration of Islamic beliefs and history that aims to challenge American Islamophobia." The review continues, "Debut author Slocum, a former Christian missionary to Kazakhstan, writes that he was horrified at ignorant depictions of Muslims in American media after the 9/11 attacks. During his years as a missionary, he "never changed anyone's mind to become a believer in the Bible," he says, but his newfound Muslim friends left an indelible mark on his own life — particularly, the fact that their culture prized hospitality toward strangers."

<u>Booklist</u> reviewer Muhammed Hassanali describes the book as "well-researched, cogently argued, and drawing on the work of scholars as well as personal insights. Slocum's work avoids clichés and deeply examines the complex relationship between Islam and the West. In the end, Slocum unmasks a clash of ignorance and reveals a shared humanity to which we can all relate."

Slocum, an outspoken peace activist, former Christian missionary and founder of the nonpartisan, nonreligious <u>SalaamUSA.org</u>, is on a mission to challenge Islamophobia and encourage readers to see through the rising anti-Muslim sentiment. He toured North America from San Diego to Vancouver, B.C. following his book release in July, sharing his message of peace and denouncing the use of <u>Islamophobia as a political weapon</u>.

"I put my heart and soul into writing this book on behalf of my many, many Muslim friends — the warmest, kindest, most generous people I know," said Slocum. "It breaks my heart to see them targeted in hate crimes because of prolific misrepresentation and generalization, often used intentionally for political purposes. My hope is that my book will make a difference."

Vista, California-based <u>Top Reads Publishing</u> released Slocum's book to chart-topping sales, <u>rave</u> <u>reviews</u>, and widespread <u>media coverage</u>.

"As a publisher, part of my mission is to spread the ideas of authors who have a purpose and a drive to make change in the world," said Teri Rider, founder of Top Reads Publishing. "Steve had that passion, and a well-thought out manuscript, and I felt sure there would be a strong readership for his book."

According to Publicist Leann Garms, timing and pivoting the narrative to fit current events has a lot to do with raising a book's visibility in traditional media. *"Timing and relevancy for the media is key, as is monitoring current media cycles for stories to tap into,"* said Garms. *"With another 9/11 anniversary in September, Steve and his book offered a solution to rising anti-Muslim sentiment and political fear-mongering in general."* The result to date was several print, radio and even top-tier television interviews, including the top morning show in Los Angeles, KTLA 5.

Teamwork and dedication to excellence have given *Why Do they Hate Us*? the success it deserves, added Rider.

Through his book and his nonprofit, Slocum will continue his efforts to address common misconceptions about Islam such as Sharia law, jihad against infidels, women in Islam, and the true cause for the rise in Islamic terror. The next Salaam event, "Friendship Over Fear: *Strategies to Counter Anti-Muslim Bias, Discrimination and Violence*" is scheduled for January 18, 2020 in Escondido.
